

# **CONFEDERATION OF CANADIAN UNIONS**



During the 2018 Convention of the Canadian Union of Skilled Workers, delegates voted to have CUSW become an affiliate of the Confederation of Canadian Unions (CCU). CCU President Kelly Johnson, spoke to the Members of CUSW on the benefits of becoming a CCU affiliate and partnering with other like-minded Unions to work together to ensure workers are protected and heard by Government.

CCU was founded in 1969 on the initiative of Madeleine Parent and Kent Rowley celebrating 50 years of operation in 2019. CCU is dedicated to the establishment of democratic, independent Labour movement, free of the influence of American based Unions. CCU affiliate Membership is limited to democratic small & medium sized Canadian Unions.

Finding Labour partners is important to the Members of CUSW for purposes of support, education, research, lobbying, and growth. CUSW has generally focused its lobbying and approaches on MPPs and Provincial bureaucrats, whereas CCU focuses on Federal issues affecting Labour.

CCU puts on great Labour Schools, by bringing Subject Matter Experts to talk to workers about issues affecting workers. Members of CUSW have participated or have been speakers at CCU Labour schools.

CUSW has two voting Members that sit on the CCU Executive Committee which meets quarterly. The annual CCU Convention is to be held October 16<sup>th</sup> -19<sup>th</sup> this year.
