



## Health & Safety Committee

The National Health, Safety and Wellness committee would like to identify that the new **Health, Safety & Wellness Policy** has been implemented to our constitution.

We would also like to highlight the importance of the article in our constitution.

#### 11.03 (ii) Health and Safety Representative

- (a) It shall be the duty of the Health & Safety Representative to enforce the Health & Safety Act and its regulations in accordance with the authority granted to them by the Act and in conjunction with the National Constitution of the CUSW Executive Board and recognized Committees of the Union.
- (b) Health & Safety Representatives shall keep the strict confidentiality of the members, which they represent.
- (c) Health & Safety Representatives shall attend and/or make a written report to the Members in the Workplace and at the Workplace Meeting(s).
- (d) Health & Safety Representatives shall work at the direction of the Workplace Members.

The National Health, Safety and Wellness Committee is committed to ensuring our members have the tools and resources they need to manage and provide a safe and inclusive workplace as well as a strong safety culture by being able to speak out and identify hazards.

### Bruce Unit

#### Fundraising Events – Gran Fondo

Wanted to report on weekend fund raiser CUSW supported in Southampton. The event was a large well-organized weekend with the Bruce Bash on Saturday night and the various bike route runs on the Sunday morning, with lunch and a drink, as well as draws and awards after. The Sunday event was supported by 150 volunteers from community. Funding on event itself is covered by sponsors so monies raised by pledges have 100 cents on the dollar goes to the identified charity.

It will be the only Mental Health Facility in this part of the province and one that will help service our members in the future, while staying in community. The Mental Health wing will be named from the sponsors of the Gran Fondo, which CUSW is one. That was the big announcement at end of function. I have attached the sponsor pages as well as some pictures. The people that participated with us were amazed at size and scope of the event and will be back next year.

#### Quarterly Update from the CUSW Southwest Unit
