CUSW Would Also Like To Acknowledge November 16th, Louis Riel Day

Louis Riel Day is held every year on November 16 across the Métis homelands. November 16 is the anniversary of Riel's execution in 1885. During that year, Riel led Métis people in the Northwest Resistance, which was a stand against the Government of Canada because it was encroaching on Metis rights and our way-of-life. The Métis were defeated at the siege of Batoche and the Canadian government captured Riel. He was eventually put on trial where he was convicted

of treason and executed. As a result, Métis people across Canada were labeled as traitors and for generations many felt the need to hide their Métis culture and heritage. Despite this oppression, many Métis people found a way to preserve their way-of-life and passed it on to current generations. Today, the strength of the Métis Nation of Ontario (MNO) is a testament to the courage of our ancestors.

CALL FOR PARTICIPATION

Union Election Call for Nominations

In accordance with <u>Article 7.06 (vii)</u> of our constitution the National Executive Board causes an election to fill a vacancy on the National Executive Board for the balance of the 2020-2023 term. Craig Batty, our current Treasurer, has accepted a position offered by the Trustees of the Power Sector Benefit Trust and has resigned from the role of Treasurer. The first stage of the process is a Call for Nominations. We encourage members to read the background information on the Treasurer's role and download a <u>Nomination Form</u>.

About the National Executive Board:

<u>Article 7.06 (vii)</u> states that the role of the NEB "shall be to see to it that the affairs and business of the Union are being properly conducted in accordance with the Constitution." The role of the NEB is to provide oversight and Governance and to ensure that the Model outlined by the Constitution and Policies is being implemented. It is not the role of the NEB to do this work themselves.

The National Executive Board shall be the highest authority in the Union between meetings. The purpose of the National Executive Board is actually to ensure that this Constitution is implemented. The NEB members have a direct role in bringing the Constitution to life.

The National Board does not tell the Union what to do. That topic doesn't even come up at the National Board Meetings. The NEB works on behalf of the members and carries out the duties that are outlined under "National Executive Board" in the Constitution.

About the Treasurer's Role:

The Treasurer shall be responsible for the handling of all monies of the Union. Shall keep records of monies received and approved disbursements. Report to monthly meetings of the NEB, the Union audit committee and external public auditor as required. The time required to carry out these responsibilities is in addition to the time spent at NEB meetings. Lost wages are reimbursed.
